	Council will advertise the Banyule Grants Program categories and their closing dates
	for application throughout the community. Communication channels will include,

	media, e-newsletters, in public spaces such as libraries, community centres, health
	centres and neighbourhood houses and through email correspondence to networks.

	The overarching objective of this grant is to build the capacity of young people in Banyule to shape their future environment.	





min and since a	The grants are open to young people of Primary and Secondary School age
Eligibility	within Banyule Council who meet the following eligibility criteria:

	Are applying through their school, an incorporated body or are
	auspiced by an incorporated body. The auspicing entity must accept
	responsibility for the management of advanced funds and acquittal
	requirements, as well as all insurance risks of the project.
	 The School, incorporated entity or auspicer must;
	\circ Have an ABN or qualify to submit a statement by supplier and,
	 Be able to demonstrate financial viability by providing a
	current financial statement (Schools are exempt from this
	requirement).
	• Applicants must have acquitted previous Council grants and have no
	outstanding debts to Banyule Council.
	Adequate insurance, working with children checks, WorkCover and
	superannuation coverage are required to be held by recipients of
	funding.
	The project must take place in Banyule or be related to issues within Banyule.
	The grant will not fund:
	Projects in Schools outside of Banyule
	Political campaigning

Application	Your application, to be made online through SmartyGrants, is expected to detail:
	 <u>Who</u> is applying for the grant (ie Mrs Teacher on behalf of Students from Greensborough College) and who is delivering the project (i.e Year 10 Class AB from Greensborough College). <u>What</u> project will be delivered. <u>When</u> the project will start and end. <u>How</u> the project will be communicated. Your application should detail the costings of your project and at least one quote for goods or services required. Failure to produce a quote will relegate the application ineligible. Assessment Criteria & Assessment Process	 There are 3 stages in the assessment process, as outlined below: 1. Pre-eligibility 2. Banyule Environment Advisory Committee (BEAC) recommendations 3. Council approval Applications will be assessed according to the following criteria: Does the project have a positive environmental and/or social impact Is the project going to be well communicated to the wider community Does the project support Banyule City Councils push for strong climate action
	Council has a Conflict of Interest declaration which all parties involved in the assessment process must complete to ensure any interests are declared prior to the assessment of grants commencing.





Grant	All funds must be spent in accordance to the funding items set out in the
Agreement	agreement form, as well as any conditions identified within the letter of
	success from Banyule City Council.
	All grant awardees are required to acknowledge the contribution of Banyule
	City Council to the project /organisation by including reference to it in
	publications, advertising material, annual reports etc. The words "supported
	by a Banyule City Council Environmental Sustainability Grant" can be used
	and/ or the Council logo.
Acquittele	The Acquittal process is an important process for Council and allows us to
Acquittals	effectively understand how well funds are being spent. All awardees are
	required to complete an on-line acquittal form within one month of project
	completion.
	The report should be submitted using an online form available through
	SmartyGrants.
	Notably this requires the following to be identified:
	Where was the money spent? You must include receipts.
	What did you deliver?
	Who delivered it?
	 <u>How many people attended/were involved?</u>
	 <u>How</u> did you promote the event? You must include copy of
	communication such as flyer or Facebook post.
	Failure to acquit the grant satisfactorily will be considered a breach. A breach
	may result in requests for grant money to be returned to Council and exclude
	the group from future grant rounds.
