In Banyule the First Nations people are called the Wurundjeri Woi Wurrung.






This book is from Banyule City Council.

To make the vision we


 told the community our plans for the City of Banyule

In 2041 we will have no carbon emissions.












We will work with different organisations to stop **climate change**.

For example, we will use our money to help the environment.





• make it easy for the community to talk to us.


How we will do what we say in the vision

businesses


