What should be considered from an arts & culture perspective?

### How do you think Banyule Council can better support creative business?

- Partnership with arts based organisations that provide capacity building opportunities for local artists/creatives.
- Artist in Residence program that builds up the skills of artists.
- Arts and Culture project grants would benefit from capacity building support (e.g. administration, events, different art forms etc).
- Artists don't seem to be applying for the Inclusive Employment program.
- Language around inclusive employment potentially not familiar to artists.
- How can we support artists in starting businesses and shifting from relying on funding bodies to becoming self-sustaining?
- Potential of providing support through Pinpoint.
- Koori Heritage Trust Black Design program brings in mentors, helps with CV's, helps people apply for grants.

#### What do you think is the unique role could play/should play in local people facing barriers to work?

- Consider looking at Banyule community data to help understand what community groups/demographics to focus on.
- Importance of using accessible language to create better access and inclusion.
- What are some cultural considerations to make more processes more accessible?
- Is there a way to support unsuccessful applicants through things like funding, grant opportunities, etc.
- Mentorships understanding the interests of applicants/mentees and then matching them with a suitable mentor. Not only benefits mentee but is also good professional development/CV builder for mentors.
- Is there an opportunity for people from business owners to be involved in the interview/application process to have them more involved?

#### Discussion

#### Highlights, challenges, opportunities

- What have we learned from COVID and the changes that took place?
- Struggle of ticket sales post COVID, whilst free events have increased.
- Arts and culture grant projects are becoming more varied. Lots of people are also looking to activate Banyule spaces.
- Art Acquisition Working Group was a good experience great to be part of a tangible task and was well organised.
- Jade Lillie was a highlight for Creative Banyule strategy consultation.
- Having a councillor who is less familiar/invested in arts on the committee?
- Good program good mix of types of events.
- Good to move events around the municipality but also don't want to dilute the offerings.
- Events are well executed.
- Youth events are very strong, especially music ones.
- Growth in events is very difficult in this environment.
- Is there an opportunity to change up formats of some of the events?
- Struggle of ticket sales post COVID, whilst free events have increased, people are not showing up. Is there a way to have less gaps?
  - Less predictable these days (ranges from 50% to 100% turn out).
  - Small payment (e.g. \$5 that goes to charity) to create a sense of commitment.

#### Any advice for the next committee?

- Continuity of thinking between one meeting and the next has been challenging.
- Potentially not getting out as much of the committee as possible, could be doing more (e.g. possibilities with things like event support). Should do more call outs for help/support.
- Using working group model for other art forms. Are there other art forms that could do with working group focused help?
- Enjoyed working groups felt more connected to the community.
- There was good consultation with BACAC well organised, with lots of opportunities to contribute.
- Strong public art and visual art focus. Looking at other art forms writing, literature, music, more different art forms.
- Creative Banyule Actions an opportunity for the committee to be involved with the delivery of actions.
- Tangible hands on involvement is valued.
- Possibility of on the ground festival/event involvement provide feedback around events/festivals as a participant/audience member.
- Encourage committee members to attend events together/collectively.
- Didn't feel like it was burdensome which was a nice feeling.
- Felt really smooth and engaging good experience.
- Ask committee members what they would like to do at the start of process/new committee.
- Takes a while to understand/get to know the rest of the committee.
- Challenging term with COVID.
- Early on would be good to have an informal social event before starting the committee pizza night. Ice breaker.
- Ice breakers at the start of the meeting.

- Would be great to work together/collaborate with other committees
