- At the Ordinary Council Meeting on 12 April 2021, Council resolved to give notice for the preparation of the Budget 2021-2025 and the preparation of the Revenue and Rating Plan 2021-2025. Subsequently, Council commenced a public exhibition period.
- The proposed Budget 2021-2025 and the proposed Revenue and Rating Plan 2021-2025 were made available for community comment from 14 April 2021 to 11 May 2021, enabling members of the community to provide written submissions.
- Sixty-nine (69) submissions were received in relation to the Budget and Revenue and Rating Plan.
- One submission was received after the closing of submissions to make a total of seventy (70) submissions.
- The submissions received are presented in a summary form as an attachment to this report. Full copies of all submissions have been provided to Councillors for their information and review prior to the 26 May 2021 Council Meeting.
- At the time of writing this report there were Twenty-six (26) submitters who have requested to be heard.

- The seventy (70) submissions received are presented in a summary form as an attachment to this report. At the time of writing this report there were twenty-six (26) submitters who have requested to be heard.
- The options available to the submitters on the night are yet to be confirmed by the submitters that have indicated that they wish to be heard. Banyule City Council is offering:

- Full copies of all submissions have been made available to Councillors prior to this meeting.

Public Exhibition Period

• At the Council Meeting on Monday, 12 April 2021, notice was given for the preparation of the Budget 2021-2025 and the preparation of the Revenue and Rating Plan 2021-2025.

- Copies of the proposed Budget 2021-2025 and proposed Revenue and Rating Plan 2021-2025 were made available for community comment from 14 April 2021 to 11 May 2021 on Council's website.
- As at the conclusion of the public exhibition period Sixty-nine (69) submissions had been received in relation to the proposed Budget and proposed Revenue and Rating Plan.
- An additional submission was received after the conclusion of the exhibition period, this submission is included with the others for a total of seventy (70) submissions.
- All submissions received have been incorporated into this report and are presented for Council consideration.
- Submissions are de-identified to the public where privacy concerns are evident.
- All Councillors receive copies of all the full submissions for consideration.

Timelines

- Public submissions heard at this meeting on 26 May 2021.
- Consideration of these submissions will be at a Council Meeting to be held on Monday, 7 June 2021 where the agreed outcomes are to be endorsed.
- Consideration to adopt the proposed Budget 2021-2025 and proposed Revenue and Rating Plan 2021-2025 with or without amendment will be held at a Council Meeting on Monday, 28 June 2021.

LEGAL CONSIDERATION

- Council has followed the legislative requirements in accordance with the *Local Government Act 2020* (the 2020 Act) and in accordance with the Council's Community Engagement Policy.
- Submitters have been provided with the opportunity to be heard and address Council in support of their submissions.

 a conflict of interest for the purposes of approving the Budget or Council Plan if
 the:
 - o Council previously approved the matter for inclusion, and
 - Councillor disclosed the nature of the conflict of interest when the decision in respect of the matter was previously considered and made.

- Council provided opportunity to consult with the community regarding the development of the proposed Budget and proposed Revenue and Rating Plan as documented within the 'Banyule 2041 Shaping Our Future' Stage 1 key findings report. <u>Banyule 2041 Shaping Our Future - Engagement Findings Report</u>
- The Shaping Banyule website has increased opportunities for the community to engage with Council and provide comment. Much of the information utilised for the development of the Budget 2021-2025 has been carried over from the current Council Plan.

• Internal consultation was also undertaken with Councillors and Council staff to inform the development of both the proposed Budget and proposed Revenue and Rating Plan. This included consideration of key emerging issues, priorities and resource requirements.

The Budget disappointingly continues the inexorable increase in annual rates to the maximum statutorily allowed rating cap. The submission requests Council to support a zero-rate freeze for 2 years.

Employee Costs

The more BCC increases its efficiency by decreasing operating costs, especially Employee Costs, the greater becomes the discretionary bottom line for funding future Capital Projects and Initiatives. This augurs well for the future financial position of BCC.

Infrastructure and initiatives - Capital Works

Banyule continues to fail year-in year-out to complete its Capital Works program by considerable amounts. It would assist ratepayers if BCC was more transparent and open and explained in detail precisely why annual capital works are successively not completed.

Debt management

Given the amount of money BCC has made from its property sales to developers over the recent years, the Submitter concurs that it is financially prudent and appropriate to extinguish associated debt. Unlike previous loans being paid down, it appears that the proposed new debt will not be revenue / profit producing.

Investment Property valuation \$33.34m remains the same as at 30/6/2021 and the four budget years thereafter to 2025?
