Budget 2023/24

In the face of increasing inflation and cost pressures, Banyule remains in a secure and sustainable financial position as we adopt our Budget.

We've maintained services without increasing borrowings and we're delivering \$40.53 million new funding for capital works.

Our FOGO waste service introduced in July 2022 has been a great success and, by cutting waste going to landfill, has helped stem the increasing cost of waste services (not to mention the environmental advantages).

Turn over for a snapshot of the Budget. Here are just some of the projects we're delivering to keep improving facilities in Beale Ward:



Working together to improve pedestrian safety

Encouraging walking as a form of transport is a major objective of Banyule Council.

In this year's budget, we are funding works along Karingal Dve to help facilitate safe pedestrian access between Sherbourne Rd and Allipol Ct. It includes new sections of footpath and refuge islands to make it easier to cross Karingal Dve towards Nillumbik.

I know many of you have pushed for these works and I have advocated on your behalf, as has Eltham MP Vicki Ward and past councillors, so it's great to see this project get the green light. It's been a true team effort!


