Pedestrian and road safety improvements

St Helena Road crossing

Council is working through the final stages of the process to install a new pedestrian crossing on St Helena Road.

We've completed detailed designs for a crossing between Allumba Drive and Charles Hartley Drive, near Simonelli Reserve, and are waiting for permit approvals from the Department of Transport and Planning (DTP).

Pedestrian operated signals are one of the most complex civil infrastructure projects to design and deliver. Council is required to obtain a range of permits. We expect construction to be finished by the end of this year.

Karingal Drive footpath

We're also working with DTP on upgrading the footpath along Karingal Drive.

Arterial roads such Karingal Drive are managed by the department and we need to get their approval before starting work.

We're working on detailed designs for continuing the footpath on the west side of Karingal Drive between Sherbourne Road and Nerreman Gateway, with pedestrian crossings near Nerreman Gateway and Allipol Court.

We anticipate DTP approval by the end of the financial year, which means the new footpath would be completed by the end of 2024.
